



WORKPLACE INJURIES



Starting 2023, SHENA and OHD MOH embarked on a shared database to consolidate workplace accidents and occupational diseases.

In 2024, the majority of these injuries involved **elementary workers** with:

- Superficial injuries and open wounds (41%), and
- 2. Upper extremities (36%)





INTERNATIONAL STATISTICAL CLASSIFICATION OF DISEASES AND RELATED HEALTH PROBLEMS, ICD-10








CASE STUDY 1 – PIPE LIFTING ACCIDENT LEADING TO PERMANENT DISABILITY

DATE OF INCIDENT: 12 JAN 2024

A laborer was tasked to assist with lifting operations to load 8-tonne pipes from a pipe stack onto the back of a truck. He was attaching the slings to the pipes while standing on top of the pipe stack, when the pipe stack suddenly gave way and his legs were crushed between the 8-tonne pipes. IP's left leg had to be amputated up to the knee.

INVESTIGATION FINDINGS

- ☐ Lack of competency i.e., IP was not trained nor experienced in lifting activities.
- Lack of hazard awareness i.e., IP remained standing on the pipe stack throughout the activity.
- Standard Operating Procedures were not communicated to the workers hence not implemented/ followed.
- No risk assessment conducted for the lifting activity.
- Language barrier between the workers.



The Safety, Health and Environment National Authority (SHENA) is issuing a reminder on the importance of rigorous safety measures to be undertaken by all towing companies, operators, and personnel when operating towing. Towing operations present unique challenges, including roadside hazards, the handling of heavy equipment, and exposure to varying environmental conditions. By addressing these risks proactively, towing professionals can ensure safer and more efficient operations while maintaining compliance to the Workplace Safety and Health Act, CAP_277.

CURRENT SITUATION

Various unsafe conditions are observed during towing operations work activities, such as workers railing to adhere to PPE requirements, unsafe positioning of tow trucks or improper setup at recovery sites, inadequate or missing traffic control measures (e.g., cones, signage), pulling winches in poor condition such as damaged wire ropes, and signs of equipment wear or maffunction. Proactively identifying and resolving these issues is crucial to maintaining a safe work environment. These observations underscore the urgent need for towing operators and supervisors to implement stringent safety measures and protocols to mitigate risks and ensure compliance with the Workplace Safety and Health Act, CAP. 277 and its regulations thereunder.

TARGET AUDIENCE AND OPERATIONAL RISKS

The WSHN applies to towing companies and workers engaged in:

- Roadside assistance.
- Recovery and transportation of vehicles.
- Maintenance or storage operations at car workshops.

The Safety, Health, and Environment National Authority (SHENA) urges all principals, employers, occupiers, self-employed persons, and persons at work to implement strict safety measures and prioritise ladder safety in the workplace.

Ladders, essential for temporary elevated work, carry risks should not be underestimated, even during routine maintenance. While comprehensive risk assessments may not be required for basic ladder use, adhering to safety procedures is crucial to prevent accidents.

INCIDENT STATISTICS

Between June 2022 and March 2025, SHENA recorded 34 ladder-related incidents across various sectors, resulting in various injuries, including fractures and one fatality from a severe head injury. Key contributing factors include:

- · Falls from unstable or makeshift ladders
- · Ladders used in wet conditions
- · Improper setup or support, including inadequate securing or stabilising measures
- · Missed steps while ascending or descending a ladder

IDENTIFIED RISK FACTORS

Common risk factors include:

- . Use of damaged or make-shift ladders
- · Climbing solo without supervision
- Use A-frame ladders improperly
- Working at heights without maintaining three points of contact or, when necessary, without a harness and lifeline (e.g., on fixed ladders)
- Operating on slippery or uneven surfaces
- · Carrying tools while ascending or descending

The Safety, Health, and Environment National Authority (SHENA) would like to remind all principals, employers, occupiers, self-employed persons, and persons at work to remain vigilant against the risks posed by harmful insects and animal attacks in the workplace.

Although such risks or incidents are relatively uncommon, certain workplace activities, depending on the surroundings may increase the likelihood of risks or encounters. Below are the examples of tasks closely associated with such risks:

- · Pruning hedges near highways and roads;
- · Working in dense vegetation or near water bodies;
- Handling waste or food that attracts animals; or
- · Operating in remote or wildlife-prone areas.

NCIDENT STATISTICS

Between January 2023 and March 2025, SHENA recorded 11 workplace injuries caused by harmful insects and animals, ranging from dog bites (4 cases), crocodile attacks (3 cases), snake bites (3 cases) and bee stings (1 case). These statistics emphasise the need for proactive safety measures in high-risk working environments.

RECOMMENDED SAFETY MEASURES & SAFE WORKING PROCEDURES

To effectively minimise the risks, the following control measures and safe work practices should be implemented:

1. Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)

 Provide appropriate PPE on job-specific risks, such as snake gaiters, heavy-duty gloves, and long-sleeved clothing for high-exposure activities and ensure these PPEs are worn.




