Purpose: This Note to Industry (NTI) serves as an announcement to inform all relevant stakeholders with regards to the commencement date of compounding of offences for failure to appoint of Workplace Safety and Health (WSH) Officer, WSH Co-ordinator and breaches of First-Aid requirements.

With reference to the NTI issued on 29<sup>th</sup> September 2023 on the Commencement of Compound Fines for WSH Officer, WSH Co-ordinator and First-Aid Requirements (NTI Ref. No. 2023/NTI/09), the Safety, Health and Environment National Authority (SHENA) hereby notifies all Principals, Occupiers, Employers and Self-Employed Persons on the commencement date of compounding of offences to the Occupier of their workplace for any contraventions to the following:
