- Factories engaged in the manufacture of semiconductor wafers; and
- Factories engaged in the manufacture of fabricated metal products, machinery or equipment, in which 100 or more persons are employed.
- All worksites (WSH (Construction) Regulations)

GUIDANCE ON ESTABLISHMENT OF
WSH COMMITTEE IN A WORKPLACE

These Regulations shall apply in relation to every workplace in which 50 or more persons are ordinarily at work



50 WORKERS
OR MORE

Chair by Manager or CEO of the workplace

WSH Officer / Co-ordinator / Focal Point
as a secretary

Meeting at least once a month

WSH COMMITTEE

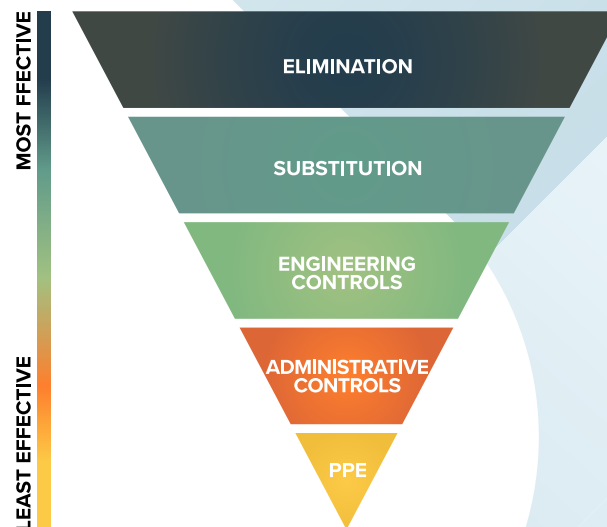
ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES	FUNCTIONS
Conduct WSH Meeting - at least once a month	General inspection of the workplace
Minutes of Meeting need to be captured	Inspection of workplace after accident or dangerous occurrence
WSH Officer/Co-ordinator/ Focal acts as a secretary	Promote safety and health at the workplace

WORKPLACE SAFETY AND HEALTH (RISK MANAGEMENT) REGULATIONS

In every workplace, the employer, self-employed person and principal shall conduct a risk assessment in relation to the safety and health risks posed to any person at work

- Any foreseeable risk shall be eliminated as far as reasonably practicable.
- Hierarchy of Control shall become a reference as a practicable measure to minimize the risk.

Hierarchy of Control



- Record of risk assessment should be maintained for a period **not less than 3 years** and any measure of safe work implemented.

Initial Incident Notification (IIN)

Types of Reportable Incidents at a Workplace

FATALITY	INJURY	DANGEROUS OCCURRENCES	OCCUPATIONAL DISEASE	MAJOR ACCIDENT
DEFINITION Death of any Employee, or self-employed person	DEFINITION Injury to employee who was given more than 3 days sick leave or admitted 24hrs in hospital Accident to any person who is not at work or self-employed person at the workplace which requires him to be taken to hospital for treatment in respect to that injury	DEFINITION Any occurrence specified in the Schedule 2	DEFINITION Any disease specified in the Schedule 3	DEFINITION Uncontrolled loss of containment, fire or explosion leading to serious danger to health, property or environment Major damage to facility structure Death or serious injury to 3 or more persons

WHO TO REPORT?	WHEN TO REPORT?
EMPLOYER	Death of employee Employee granted more than 3 consecutive days of sick leave Employee admitted in a hospital for at least 24 hours for observation and treatment Dangerous Occurrence (i.e. fire, gas explosion, scaffold collapses, lifting equipment failure, etc.)
OCCUPIER	Death of any persons who is not at work and Self-employed person Any person or Self-employed person injured and taken to the hospital for treatment
MEDICAL PRACTITIONER	After diagnosis of any employee with an occupational disease
