Our mandate and the standards outlined in Convention 187 are aligned towards this goal by establishing national tools to significantly reduce occupational accidents, injuries, and diseases.

The ratification of ILO Convention 187 aligns seamlessly with our Wawasan 2035. By prioritising occupational safety and health, ratification directly supports the key pillars of Wawasan 2035. Firstly, the goal of a high-quality of life for all citizens by ensuring safe and healthy working environments.

Secondly, the fostering of a sustainable and resilient economy by promoting productivity and reducing the economic burden of workplace accidents and illnesses. And lastly, ratification supports the development of a just and equitable society by protecting the rights and well-being of workers.

As we build safe and healthy workplaces together, we contribute to increased productivity and efficiency, we are enhancing the reputation of Brunei Darussalam for growth and development as well as demonstrating a social commitment to protection of the basic well-being of workers as a priority.

There will likely be challenges associated in living up to standards of the Convention; such as limited resources, a lack of awareness and understanding of Convention requirements, effective enforcement of OSH laws and regulations especially in under-regulated sectors such as informal work and MSMEs, and an unsuitable cultural attitude to prioritize financial progress over work safety.



However, by working and resolving stumbling-block together, we can ensure that the principles of ILO Convention 187 are effectively implemented, leading to safer, healthier, and more productive workplaces.

This workshop aims to offer a valuable opportunity for stakeholders from various sectors to come together and take stock of our current state in terms of OSH as well as to discuss the application of ILO Convention No. 187 in the Brunei Darussalam context.
