Recalling the launching ceremony of our Safety Month held on the 15<sup>th</sup> of May 2023, which was graciously officiated by Yang Berhormat Pehin Datu Lailaraja Major General (Retired) Dato Paduka Seri Haji Awang Halbi bin Haji Mohd Yussof, Minister at the Prime Minister's Office and Minister of Defence II, as Minister in Charge of SHENA, we recognized the Resolution adopted by the International Labour Organization in 2022 that all ILO Member States, including Brunei Darussalam, have an obligation to respect, promote and realize the fundamental right that all workers have to a safe and healthy working environment. Needless to say, the theme for the World Day of Safety and Health at Work this year, i.e. safe and healthy workplaces as a fundamental principle and right at work, resonates strongly, not only with SHENA as the national regulatory authority but also with all organizations where safety and health at work apply. In his speech, Yang Berhormat Pehin highlighted the need to reflect on the Nation's performance and address challenges to reduce incidents surrounding workplace injuries and fatalities. He stated that improving workplace safety and health in Brunei Darussalam is a mandate under Goal 2 of Wawasan Brunei 2035. He called on policymakers, employers and workers to collaborate to establish effective safe systems at the workplace and cultivate a preventive culture.



Throughout the activities that have been organized by SHENA over the past few weeks, we have been striving to underscore to all attendees and the general public that the safety and health culture of an organisation is not merely having documentation and policies, but more importantly the application of these in demonstrating commitment, values, attitudes, behaviours and competency of the people working there. Organizations in all spheres of work, public and private sectors, must continue to reflect on the effectiveness of their organisation's safety management system and their commitment to safety and health as a priority.
